## FIFTY-EIGHTH REGIMENT INDIANA VOLUNTEERS.

The Fifty-Eighth Regiment was organized at Princeton in October, 1861, with Henry M. Carr as Colonel, and left for the field in December, crossing the Ohio river at Louisville. It was assigned to Wood's division of Buell's army, and during the winter of 1861 and 1862 marched through Central Kentucky, stopping a few weeks at Bardstown, Lebanon, Spring Garden and Bowling Green. On the 1st of March it reached Nashville, and remained there until the 1st of April, when it started for Pittsburg Landing, which place was reached on the evening of the second day's battle of Shiloh. The regiment rested here for a while and then engaged in the siege of Corinth. After the evacuation it marched into Northern Alabama, and thence to Shelbyville, Tennessee. From Shelbyville it moved to Decherd, where it lay for a few weeks and then marched with Buell's army to Nashville, and thence to Louisville, reaching the last named city on the 1st of October. It immediately started back in pursuit of Bragg's army, reaching Nashville in the latter part of November.

On the 26th of December the regiment marched toward Murfreesboro, and on the day following it charged the rebels at Lavergne. On the 31st of December, 1862, and 1st and 2d of January, 1863, it participated in the battle of Stone river, being attached to Hascall's Brigade of Wood's Division of the Twenty-First Corps, and losing eighteen killed, eighty-seven wounded and five missing—making a total loss of one hundred and ten.

and seventy veterans and returned recruits of the Tenth Indiana were transferred to this regiment, and continued to serve with the Fifty-Eighth until its final discharge.

When General Sherman's army was divided at Atlanta, in November, the Fifty-eighth was assigned to duty with the Army of Georgia, which was composed of the Fourteenth and Twentieth Corps, and was commanded by Major General Slocum. This regiment did all the bridging and repairing of roads for that army during the campaign from Atlanta to Savannah, including a bridge across the Savannah river, opposite the city, this bridge being over three thousand feet in length. On the 31st of December, 1864, the non-veterans of the regiment were mustered out at Savannah and returned home.

On the campaign through South Carolina to Goldsboro, North Carolina, the Fifty-eighth did all the bridging for the Army of Georgia, including a second bridge over the Savannah, at Sister's Ferry, where the men had to work, for six days, in water from two to four feet deep, in clearing out and repairing the road. In this campaign the regiment made over sixteen thousand feet of bridges. While attached to the Engineer Department, though

After this engagement the regiment remained in the vicinity of Murfreesboro until the movement against Tullahoma was commenced, when it moved with the army in that direction. It was in the brigade that was the first to enter Chattanooga, and was engaged in the battle of Chickamauga from its commencement to its close, losing in killed, wounded and missing, one hundred and seventy-one out of an aggregate of four hundred engaged.

Falling back with the army to Chattanooga the regiment remained there, and was engaged in the battle of Chattanooga on the 23d of November, and was in Wagner's Brigade of Sheridan's Division in the charge on Mission Ridge on the 25th of November, losing five killed and sixty-one wounded. Immediately after it made a forced march to Knoxville, which place was then besieged by Longstreet's army. During the winter of 1863 and 1864, the regiment was encamped among the hills of East Tennessee without tents, and only such rations as could be gathered from a poor and scanty country. On the 24th of January, 1864, the regiment re-enlisted as a veteran organization, and on the 4th of March arrived at Indianapolis on veteran furlough.

Upon its return to Chattanooga in April, it was assigned to the Engineer Department, and immediately took charge of the pontoon trains of Sherman's army. The regiment did all the bridging for Sherman's army from Chattanooga to Atlanta, bridging some of the rivers as many as sixteen times, and often under the fire of the enemy. In October, 1864, one hundred

not in any heavy engagements, the regiment was not free from exposure, being the first on the banks of streams and the last to leave, and the greater part of the time its work was done after night, with the enemy on the opposite bank.

After the surrender of Johnson's army the regiment marched from Goldsboro to Washington City, by the way of Richmond, bridging all the streams on the route except the James river. After remaining at Washington for a brief period, it was transferred to Louisville, Kentucky, where, on the 25th of July, 1865, it was mustered out of service. Proceeding to Indianapolis, with five hundred and fifty men, it was present at a reception given to returned troops in the Capitol grounds, on the 27th of July, on which occasion the regiment was addressed by Lieutenant Governor Conrad Baker and others. In a few days afterwards it was finally discharged from service. In July, 1865, ninety men were transferred to the regiment from the One Hundred and First Indiana, being the recruits remaining in service after the muster out of that organization. These were mustered out with the Fifty-eighth. During its term of service the regiment lost in battle and by disease two hundred and sixty-five men.
