Thomas Doherty a soldier of the Revolution
and Applicant for a Pension this
day produced in Com. his declaration
under the Act of Congress passed
June 1832 and subscribed and made
oath to the same and the certificate
of Abner Cate and John Donaho
thereunder written was also subscribed
and sworn to in open Com. where
upon the Com. do hereby declare their
opinion after the investigation of the
matter and after getting the inter-
rogatories prescribed by the War
Department that the above Appli-
cant was a Revolutionary Soldier
as he states and the Com. fur-
ther certifying that it appears to them
that Abner Cate and John Donaho
who subscribed the certificate above
named are Residents in this County
and are credible persons and that
their statement is entitled to credit

On this 12th day of May 1834 personally
appeared in open Court before the Court
of the County aforesaid now sitting Thomas
Dobson a resident of said County & State
aged about seventy six years, who being
first duly sworn according to law doth
on his oath make the following Decla-
ration in order to obtain the benefit
of the Act of Congress passed June 7th
1832. That he entered the service of the
United States under the following named
Officers and served as herein stated

This applicant has no record of his
age but from the best information
he has received he was born in
Orange County in the State of North
Carolina in the year 1758 or 1759
that in his early infancy his father
moved to South Carolina settled
between Broad and Saluda rivers
(the County or District not recollecting)
where the Revolution found this
applicant and where he was drafted
for five months this was as
well as this applicant now recollects
about three years before the close
of the war. He states that his

Captain was by the name of Tull
under whom Major Dofek (his
appl. name, father) was Lieutenant
and James Higgins Ensign
of the South Carolina Militia
That he was employed at Staffs
from work and marched thence
through a wilderness country to
Seneca Fort on the Savannah River
in Georgia - that he remained
on duty in said Fort for three
months when being sick he was
discharged and returned home
he received a discharge for his
service of six months signed
as he believes by his Capt but
has lost the same - Capt Tull
commanded at the Fort

He states that about twelve months
after he returned home he
was again drafted for four months
under Capt John Brunson of the
S. Carolina Militia that he was
employed about three miles below
Camden and marched thence to
Lawrence's Landing ferry on
the Apopka River where he was stationed

until his term expired when he was
discharged and returned home he
received a written discharge
signed as he believes by his
Capt but had lost the same

He states that after the close
of the war he removed to Orange
County N. Carolina thence to the
State of Tennessee and

thence to the County of Stephens
in the State of Kentucky where
he now resides. He states that
he served ^{his first long} in a State on the frontier
which was garrisoned by Militia
and saw no regular ^{no doubt he began that he was on his plain} Officer ^{unless}
Colo. Shelly who commanded at Law.

Among a Farmers' ferry was such
He states that he is known to Abner
Cats & John Donaho. residing in his
present neighborhood who can tes-
tify to his character for veracity &
their belief of his services as a
Soldier of the Revolution

He states that he is an illiterate
old man and that he was in-
formed he would have to prove
his services positively to entitle

him to a pension upon the act
of Congress before referred to now
was, he ~~has~~ informed me
very recently - which accounts for
his having deferred this application
to this late period as he has no
documentary evidence and that the
honors of no person whose testimony
he can procure who can testify
to his services - He hereby relinquishes
every claim whatever to a pension
annuity except the present ~~claim~~
that his name is not on the pension
