

No 1 Henry of Harris in Berkeley County. Commencing April Court 1776

Thomas Mather produced in Court a Certificate for a Horse impressed for the use of the State valued at fifty five pounds about seven years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

Francis Willis produced in Court a Certificate for three Bay Horses impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at two hundred and fifteen pounds upwards of fifteen years high each the valuation on each and the other five years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

Philip Pendleton produced in Court a Certificate for a Horse impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at fifty six pounds about fourteen and a half years high about six years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

Elizabeth Curran produced in Court a Certificate for a Horse impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at forty two pounds Ten Shillings about fourteen years and one month high the Valuation which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

A Certificate was produced in Court for General Charles Lee for three Horses impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at One Hundred and twenty pounds he is allowed One Hundred and five pounds as the Court are of Opinion that the Valuation was excessive two of the said Horses about fourteen and a half years high Eleven or Twelve years old the other about fifteen years high Seven years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

James Steele is allowed One pound five Shillings for seventy seven pounds of Beef also a Blanket furnished the State which is ordered to be certified

Philip Pendleton is allowed Two pounds eight Shillings for Twelve Bushels wheat and four Shillings of Bushell furnished the State which is ordered to be certified

James Miller is allowed Two pounds Ten Shillings for one Bed quilt impressed for the use of the State valued at thirteen Dollars which is ordered to be certified

Thomas Belstone produced in Court a Certificate for a Horse impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at fifty five pounds about seven years high five years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

Abraham Shephard produced in Court a Certificate for a Horse impressed for the use of the State in the Continental Service valued at thirty pounds upwards of fifteen years high seven or seven years old which Valuation is approved of and ordered to be certified

William Burns is allowed thirteen Shillings and nine pence for one and one Bushell and a half of Corn and five Horses Bayonet and eight furnished Colonel Blounts Regiment of Light Dragoons for the use of the State in the Continental Service which is ordered to be certified

Joseph Hedge sent produced in Court a Certificate for a man engaged

Margaret Worthington is allowed five pounds for two Hacks Hays furnished the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 159 John Merriman is allowed one pound Ten Shillings for one Blanket furnished the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 160 Elizabeth Tabb is allowed three Shillings for seven Days of service of the first Regiment of Light Dragoons in the Continental Service which is Ordered to be Certified
- 161 John Dill is allowed Ten Shillings furnished a Party of Colonel Danks Regiment in the service of Dragoons belonging to this State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 162 John Dill is allowed Twelve Shillings for Pasturage of seven Horses one Night in the State Service which is Ordered to be Certified
- 163 John Dill is allowed four Shillings for Pasturage of four Horses one Night in the State Service which is Ordered to be Certified
- 164 John Dill is allowed five Shillings for Pasturage of five Horses one Night employed in the State Service which is Ordered to be Recorded
- 165 James Morrison is allowed three pounds & thirteen Shillings and Nine pence for one Hundred and some Partons furnished Captain Joseph Metcalles Company in the Continental Service which is Ordered to be Certified
- 166 Joseph Lomerville is allowed one pound fifteen Shillings for seven Days Service as a Recruit in collecting, collecting and Provisions which is Ordered to be Certified
- 167 John Wainwright is allowed two pounds & Eighteen Shillings and Nine pence for seven Horses & seven Days of forage for his Company and Drivers charge for a mounted Man in the State Service which is Ordered to be Certified
- 168 John Smith is allowed five Shillings for one Blanket and Powder horn furnished the Berkeley Militia in the Service of the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 169 John Smith is allowed eleven pounds seven Shillings and six pence for nine hundred and hundred pounds of Hay for the use of the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 170 John Smith is allowed one Shilling and three pence for half a Bushel of Corn furnished the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 171 Judah Huggins is allowed five pounds for forty Bushels of Corn furnished the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 172 John Bagdie is allowed forty Shillings for eight Days Service as a recruit in collecting the collecting and Provisions which is Ordered to be Certified

- 175 Leonard Puffer is allowed one pound Twelve Shillings for Eight Bushels of Wheat furnished the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 176 John Baker is allowed forty three pounds & fifteen Shillings for three hundred and fifty Bushels Indian Corn furnished for the use of the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 177 John East is allowed three pounds Ten Shillings for eight Days Service in a Wagon Team and Driver as a Baggage Wagon for the use of the Berkeley Militia in the Service of this State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 178 James Morrison is allowed two pounds for a Horse employed for the use of the Berkeley Militia on an expedition to the westward in the Service of the State which is Ordered to be Certified
- 179 Leonard Puffer is allowed twenty Shillings for four Days Service as a Recruit in collecting the collecting and Provisions for the use of the State which is Ordered to be Certified
