He served as a colonel in the militia. N.C. S.A.R., p. 115.

Steen, James

b. 1734, County Antrim, Ireland
d. October 1780/81
m. _____ Bogard

After settling early in Union County, he apparently led a company in the Snow Campaign. He led a company against the Cherokee Indians the following year. In 1777, he was commander of Prince's Fort. In 1779, he served in Georgia and was at Stono Ferry and the siege of Savannah. Next, he was at Charleston where he remained until February 1780 (he was by then a lieutenant colonel). He was in the battles at Rocky Mount, Hanging Rock, Musgrove's Mill, Kings Mountain and was probably with Col. Brandon at Cowpens. In the summer of 1780/1781, he was stabbed to death while attempting to arrest a Tory in Rowan County, N. C. A.A.7347; X1997; X3132; Z19; Heitman, p. 517; Draper, pp. 469-470; N.C.S.A.R., p. 115.

Steen, James

He served as a wagoner and provided provisions. A.A.7347; Z199; Z200.

Steen, John

He served in the militia under Capt. Robert Montgomery and Col. Brandon after the fall of Charleston. A.A.7348; X3133.

Steen, William

He served in the militia under Cols. Waters and Brandon during 1779, 1780, 1781, 1782 and 1783. A.A.7349; X1869; X3240.

Stevens, John

See John Stephens.

Steidler, Abraham

He served in the Charleston Militia Regiment under Captain James Bentham during 1778. S.C.H.&G., LIII, 164.

Steidley, Eberhard

He served in the Charleston Militia Regiment under Captain James Bentham during 1778. S.C.H.&G., LIII, 103.

Stemwinder, Frederick

He served as a sergeant in the militia under Lt. Peter Oliver and Col. William Thomson. A.A. 7351; T200.

Stenson, Lewis

See Lewis Stinson.

Stenson, Nathan

See Nathan Stinson.

Stent, Bud

He served in the militia and was at the fall of Charleston. Yearbook, 1897.

He served under Gen. Pickens.

Stephens, Charles

d. 11 April 1804/07

m. Barbary Reid, 16 May 1791

He served as a sergeant under Capt. Liles. He was under Capt. Dogwood and Col. Henderson in the battle at Stono, where he was wounded. He was taken prisoner at the fall of Charleston, but escaped after four months imprisonment.

Stephens, John

m. Susanah _____

He served in the militia before the fall of Charleston and during 1781. A.A.7352; X317; Y953.

Stephens, John W.

S16536

b. 7 February 1764, Sussex County, Va.

While residing in Marlboro District, he enlisted during 1780 and served under Captain Eddy Hodges and Col. Culp in the mounted infantry. Next, he was under Capt. Taylor and Colonel Maham as a dragoon. (Moved to Ga.)

Stephens, Joseph

He served in the Continental Line during 1782 and 1783. A.A.7370; Y613.

Stephens, Stephen

He served in the militia after the fall of Charleston and lost a horse in service during 1781. A.A.7372; S68.

Stephenson, Alexander

See Alexander Stevenson.

Stephenson, David

b. 11 August 1761/62

d. 22 September 1819

m. Jane McCleskey (McCluskey), 28 July 1790

While residing in upper South Carolina, he enlisted under Col. Neel. He was in the siege of Charleston, the battles at Rocky Mount, Hanging Rock, Kings Mountain and Wright's Bluff. He was wounded in the head and right knee by a sword. At sometime, he served under Col. Hawthorne and Gen. Sumter. A.A. 7353A.
