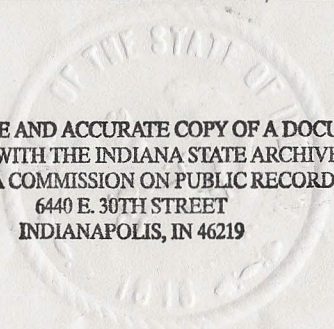

## ONE YEAR REGIMENTS OF 1865.

On the 20th of December, 1864, a call was made for eleven regiments of infantry to serve for one year, and recruiting rendezvous were established at the headquarters of each of the District Provost Marshals, from which recruits were forwarded to the general rendezvous at Indianapolis. Chief recruiting officers were, also, appointed in each District whose exertions materially aided the recruitment of the regiments. Subsequently five additional regiments for the same arm and term of service were called for, to be recruited in the same manner. Under these calls the following organizations were raised; mustered into service and sent to the field:

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-THIRD REGIMENT**—Was composed of companies from the First Congressional District and was organized and mustered into service at Indianapolis, on the 21st of February, 1865, with JOHN F. GRILL as Colonel. On the 23d the regiment was turned over to the United States, and, after being armed and equip-

ped, left on the 24th for Nashville. From thence it moved to Murfreesboro, where it performed guard duty until the 13th of May when it proceeded to Tullahoma. Moving from that place on the 26th of June to Nashville it was sent to Clarksville, at which place three companies were detached and sent to garrison Fort Donelson. Receiving orders for muster-out the regiment was brought together and marched to Nashville where it was mustered out on the 17th of October, 1865. Leaving Nashville on the 18th it arrived at Indianapolis on the 21st of October, with thirty officers and six hundred and ninety-one men, for final discharge and payment, and on the same day it was publicly received at the State House grove by the citizens and State authorities.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FOURTH REGIMENT**—Was composed of companies raised in the Second Congressional District, and was organized and mustered into service at Indianapolis on the 6th of

March, 1865, with GEORGE W. RIDDLE as Colonel. On the 9th of March the regiment left Indianapolis and arrived at Harper's Ferry, Virginia, on the 13th, where it was assigned to the First Brigade First Provisional Division of the Army of the Shenandoah, and sent to Halltown. Subsequently it was stationed for brief periods at Charlestown, Winchester, Stevenson Depot and Opequan Creek, engaging in guard duty until the 5th of August, 1865, when it was mustered out of service. On the 9th of August it arrived at Indianapolis, with thirty-seven officers and eight hundred and forty men for final discharge, and on the 11th was present at a soldier's reception given in the Capitol grounds, at which speeches were made by Lieutenant Governor Baker, General Benjamin Harrison and others.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIFTH REGIMENT**—Was recruited in the Third Congressional District and organized and mustered into service at Indianapolis on the 16th of February, 1865, with WILLIAM A. ADAMS as Colonel. On the 18th the regiment left Indianapolis and arrived at Nashville, Tennessee on the 21st, and on the 23d reported to General Stodman at Chattanooga. The same day it proceeded to Dalton, Georgia, where it was placed on duty guarding the railroad for some time, and was then moved to Marietta where it remained until the fall of 1865, when it was ordered to Cuthbert. At this place it remained on duty until its muster out in January, 1866.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-SIXTH REGIMENT**—Was recruited in the First, Third and Fourth Congressional Districts and organized at Indianapolis on the 3d of March, 1865. On the 9th it was mustered

into service, with MERIT C. WELSH as Colonel, and left Indianapolis on the 11th for Harper's Ferry, Virginia. Arriving there on the 15th it was assigned to one of the provisional divisions of the Army of the Shenandoah. From that time until the 27th of July, it was engaged in performing post and guard duty at Charlestown, Winchester, Stevenson Station, Jordan's Springs and Summit Point, Virginia. It was then ordered to the Bolay House from whence it moved to Baltimore where it was assigned to duty in the Military District of Delaware, General Lockwood commanding. One company was at once detached and placed on duty at Hicks' General Hospital, Baltimore, one company sent to Havre De Grace, and, on the 1st of August, four companies were detached and placed on duty as follows: One company at Dover, and one at Wilmington, Delaware; one at Salisbury and one at Easton, Maryland. These companies were continued on this duty until the 31st of August, 1865, when the regiment was brought together and mustered out of service, at Baltimore. Arriving at Indianapolis on the 6th of September, with thirty-two officers and seven hundred and seventy-one men for final payment and discharge, it was publicly welcomed home, at a reception meeting held in the State House grounds, at which speeches were made by Governor Morton and Generals Mansfield and Washburn, which were responded to by Colonel Welsh, Lieutenant Colonel Morrison, Major Spillman and Adjutant Hill. The regiment then marched to Camp Carrington, where it was paid off and finally discharged.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-SEVENTH REGIMENT**—Was composed of seven companies recruited in the Fifth Congressional Dis-

trict, two companies raised in the Eleventh District, and one company composed of detachments from Benton, Henry and Fayette counties. These were organized into a regiment at Indianapolis, on the 13th of March, 1865, of which MILTON PAXEN was commissioned Colonel. On the 16th it left Indianapolis for Harper's Ferry, Virginia, and on arriving there was marched to Charlestown, where it was assigned to one of the provisional divisions of the army of the Shenandoah. From that time until its muster out, on the 4th of August, 1865, it was engaged in doing guard and garrison duty at Stevenson Station, Summit Point, Berryville, Harper's Ferry, and Maryland Heights. On the 9th of August it arrived at Indianapolis, with thirty-two officers and seven hundred and forty-three men for final discharge, and was publicly welcomed home, at a reception meeting held in the State House Grove, on the 11th, at which speeches were made by Lieutenant Governor Baker, General Benjamin Harrison and others, to which Colonel Peden responded.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-EIGHTH REGIMENT**—Was recruited in the Sixth Congressional District, and was organized at Indianapolis, on the 25th of February, 1865, with NICHOLAS R. RUCKLE as Colonel. On the 28th it left for Nashville, Tennessee, and was at once placed on duty. From that time until its muster-out, the regiment was kept constantly employed in doing guard and garrison duty in the interior of Middle Tennessee. On the 6th of September, 1865, it was mustered out of service and proceeded to Indiana, arriving at Indianapolis on the 8th, with thirty-six officers and seven hundred and eighty-four men for final discharge.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-NINTH REGIMENT**—Was recruited in the Seventh Congressional District, and was organized at Indian-

apolis on the 1st day of March, 1865, with WILLIAM H. FAIRBANKS as Colonel. It left Indianapolis on the 3d for Nashville, Tennessee, and was a few weeks afterwards sent to Decatur, Alabama, in which vicinity it did duty until its muster-out. While stationed at that place, the regiment received the surrender of the rebel forces commanded by Generals Reddy and Polk, together with large quantities of arms and munitions of war. On the 18th of September it proceeded to Nashville, where it was mustered out on the 27th of September, 1865. Arriving at Indianapolis on the 29th, with thirty officers and eight hundred men, it was publicly welcomed home, at a reception meeting held in the Capitol grounds, and was addressed by Governor Morton, General Finnell, of Kentucky, and others.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTIETH REGIMENT**—Was recruited in the Eighth Congressional District, and was organized at Indianapolis, on the 9th of March, 1865, with MARSH B. TAYLOR as Colonel. On the 13th it left Indianapolis for Harper's Ferry, Virginia, arriving there on the 17th, and shortly after was marched to Charlestown. From thence it moved to Winchester, and from there to Stevenson Station, where it remained until the 27th of June. It then marched to Jordan's Springs, near Opequan, where it remained until its muster-out, on the 5th of August, 1865. On the 9th of August it arrived at Indianapolis with twenty-five officers and eight hundred and seventy men for final discharge, and on the 11th was present at a reception given to returned regiments in the State House grove, where it was addressed by Lieutenant Governor Baker, General Benjamin Harrison and others.

**THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-FIRST REGIMENT**—Was composed of companies raised in the Ninth Congressional District, and
